Multicom Resources Limited (Multicom) is a Queensland based exploration and mining company. The Saint Elmo Project (the Project) is a proposed shallow open cut vanadium mine located approximately 25 kilometres (km) east of Julia Creek, in north west Queensland.

Construction is expected to commence in 2020. The Project is anticipated to directly employ over 200 people during construction and more than 150 people once the mine is fully operational at 10,000 tonnes per annum. Throughout all phases of the Project, Multicom will seek to preferentially employ a local workforce. The local workforce will be supplemented with a drive-in drive-out (DIDO) workforce from regional Queensland centres, and fly-in-fly-out (FIFO) via Mount Isa Airport. Multicom is targeting first production of vanadium pentoxide in late 2021.

Multicom and Epic Environmental Pty Ltd (Epic) are inviting any interested members of the community to learn more about the Project and have the opportunity to provide feedback and ask questions during public information sessions held in regional locations.
